SPRING HOME MAINTENANCE TIPS

CHECK SEALS AROUND WINDOWS AND DOORS

Winter weather can crack and harden caulk and other weather seals. Inspect them and make repairs as needed. You can reduce your air conditioning bill and prevent water from entering your home and causing damage.

CLEAN DECKS AND DRIVEWAYS

Using a pressure washer is an effective way to clean mold and mildew off of outside surfaces.

CUT OVERGROWTH

Trim overgrown trees and hedges away from your home to discourage the growth of mold and mildew. Branches should be at least 7 feet away from the exterior of your home to prolong the life of your siding and roof.

CHECK YOUR PAINT

Look for chipped, cracked paint on the exterior of your home. Sand it down so there are no rough edges, prime the bare wood surface and paint with a high quality paint product.

CLEAN OUT YOUR GUTTERS

Check gutters for any foliage build-up and remove all debris. Spring is a great time to ensure all drainage areas remain clear. Also make sure the downspouts are clean and pointing at least two feet away from foundation walls.

Practical Ways to be GREEN in the Bathroom

Here are a few green tips from This Old House to help you save money in your bathroom:

RUN THE SHOWER.

Place a 1-gallon bucket under the running water, then see how long it takes for it to fill up. If it's less than 20 seconds, replace the showerhead with one that sprays 1.5 gallons per minute. That could save as much as 14,600 gallons of water per year – especially if you limit your showers to 10 minutes or less. It can also save you as much as \$22 on your annual water bill and \$150 per year on water heating.

GO FROM SCALDING TO JUST HOT.

Turn your water heater's temperature setting down from the standard 140 to 120 degrees. Not only will this save you some bucks, it will also slow down mineral buildup and corrosion, prolonging the life of your tank. Since a new water heater costs about \$900 installed, each additional year of use saves you money as well.

Building Fun Facts

- The Empire State Building was built in just 11 months. The top of the building was originally intended as a mooring place for dirigibles.
- The Golden Gate Bridge, built in 1937, cost \$35 million and took four years to build.
- Britain's Buckingham Palace consists of 775 rooms.
- The original World Trade Center had 110 stories in each tower and seven underground levels. There were 239 elevators in the complex and 43,600 windows.
- The Statue of Liberty's index finger is 8 feet long and her fingernail is 10" x 13". Lady Liberty's foot is 25' long, and she wears a size 879 shoe!
- The tallest building in the world is Burj Khalifa in Dubai. It is 2,717 feet tall. The same designer of the Burj Khalifa, Adrian Smith, has drawn up an even more ambitious project, the Kingdom Tower in Saudi Arabia. It is slated to open in 2017 and soar to 3,281 feet—a full kilometer.
