OUTDOOR KITCHEN



Bob and Deb loved spending time on their deck, but because it was on the south side of their home, it did not have shade in the afternoon or evening. They used a portable canopy for shade for a number of years but decided they'd like a larger, more permanent structure to ward off the heat and rain. Their idea started out as a covered porch, but it snowballed into including a place for the grill, then a sink, and finally cabinets for storage and a granite bar.

LAUNDRY HACKS THAT WILL SAVE YOU TIME AND MONEY

- · Wash your laundry in cold water.
- · Hang your clothes to dry.
- Use dryer balls instead of chemical dryer sheets for freshness and static control.
- DIY Spot Remover Dab a small amount of baking soda and a few drops of vinegar on the stain before washing.
- Wash your delicates in a mesh laundry bag.
- Use a Fels-Naptha laundry bar as a stain remover.
- Use Shout Color Catchers to keep clothing dye from transferring.
- Always carry a Tide-to-Go pen with you.
- Purchase a laundry sorter to help save you time and prevent laundry color disasters
- Toss a clean dry towel into the dryer with your wet clothes to speed up the dry time.
- Toss your lint into the compost, or use it to make campfire starters.
- · Keep your socks paired in a mesh bag.
- · Invest in reusable lint rollers.
- Add vinegar or baking soda to the wash cycle to help brighten your whites.
- Purchase clothes that don't require ironing.
- Add a pool noodle to your drying bar to prevent creases.
- When drying sneakers, place your laces in the dryer door and "hang" them to dry on the door, instead of bouncing around during the cycle.
- Hang clothes immediately after drying to reduce wrinkles.
- Hang clothes in the bathroom during a hot shower. The steam from the shower will help loosen some wrinkles.
